Questions and Answers:

The administration has been working aggressively in trying to stop the unfunded training requirements and/or mandates that come down from the state in the form of law. We want to ensure teachers that we actively advocate against these items being mandated that take away from instructional time for our teachers and students. 4) Many of the schools in St Tammany were built with a design in which open corridors connect adjacent wings of the buildings. Considering this building design could expose children to threats from outside the school campus, what will you do to address the critical problem of ensuring school safety now and permanent changes for the future? How do you propose paying for the changes or measures you identify as a necessary solution to school safety?

School safety is a big deal right now with the threats we have seen and some schools have experienced recently. There should be certain protocols taken for the safety of children and teachers. I remember when I was in school, we had fire drills, maybe do active shooter drills. Have our police department come in and teach a short safety class. If we can have orientation for schools, we can surely have part of that with some safety training. As mentioned, in a previous answer we could look into retired military or officers that would be interested in volunteering. There is also a group of fathers that are taking matters in their own hands called "Dads on duty", maybe we can start a grass roots group like that here.

As far as that school, I would need to look at the structure plans and speak with the principal about the building and arrangements.

We need to fortify the perimeter fencing at schools. Secondly, we need the absolute use of a single point of entry for all visitors. Thirdly, the badge pass system will be complete in all 55 schools by the end of this school year which will also aid in safety. In addition to these, every school has a school resource officer, a mental health provider, and a full-time nurse to assist in supporting school safety. These changes could be funded by using the capital improvement funds that we have in place.
